40% rates rebate for drought-struck farmers

Drought-hit farmers across Corangamite Shire will receive a 40% lump sum rebate on their 2025-2026 rates and municipal charge.

Council has been allocated \$5,274,200 from the State Government's \$35.8 million funding package for selected south-west Victorian councils as part of a broader Drought Support Package.

At its August meeting yesterday, Council voted for a uniform allocation across all properties with a 'Farm' rate classification to ensure the payment is equitable.

Mayor Kate Makin said under the Primary Producer Support Payments (PPSP) program, Councils had discretion about how best to allocate the funding to support the most severely drought-affected farming rate payers.

Cr Makin said Council's Rates and Charges Collection and Hardship Policy recognises the need for respect and compassion when people need support in difficult times.

Volunteer Spotlight Shari McConachy

How long have you lived in the community?

Originally from South Gippsland, I moved to the district for my first

job out of uni when I was 21. I worked as an agronomist for Western Aerial and lived with a house mate in the hostel rooms at the Lismore Health Centre. So I've now been in the district over 20 years - almost a local!

What inspired you to start volunteering?

As a kid, both of my parents were actively involved in various community groups, so I grew up thinking that being on committees and going to evening meetings was just something adults naturally did. At Lismore I was more roped into my first role rather than putting my hand up to volunteer. Rick Vagg encouraged me to come along to the Lismore Rec Reserve AGM in my early years of living here, promising I wouldn't have to join anything straight away. Somehow I left that meeting with the job of Secretary, a role I have held now for 16 years despite my best efforts to pass it on.

What group/s or causes do you volunteer with?

There has been a variety of different groups I have volunteered with over the years (kinder, school, swimming pool, Landcare, Lions coffee stop) but my longest running, and still current, roles have been as secretary of the Lismore Recreation Reserve Committee and as a typist for the Lismore Newsletter. Both have been rewarding in different ways. I have enjoyed working with the different Committee members with the Rec Reserve over the years and seeing the slow but steady improvements we have made at the grounds. The biggest I've been involved in was the building of the Rick Vagg Social Rooms and our soon to be added Netball Change rooms which should be ready for next season.

Typing up the Lismore newsletter is a great way to help out as well as keep up with what's happening locally. It's a job that only comes around 3 - 4 times a year so is not too much of a commitment but I still feel I'm doing my bit to help a local group.

If someone was thinking of volunteering, what would you say to encourage them?

There is never a perfect time in your life to volunteer, so do it now. Whether you're studying, working full time, home with kids, or retired, everyone is busy, everyone has other priorities, but our towns can't run without help. Local groups are in desperate need of new volunteers and groups are very accommodating. If you can't make every meeting that's ok, just step and do what you can. Attending events that volunteers have put together is also a great way to support local groups.

How has volunteering changed your perspective on the town or the people in it?

Over the years, being involved in different groups has shown me that our committees are often run by a small group of dedicated volunteers who wear many different hats. Small towns wouldn't function without these committed individuals—but the workload can be exhausting. If more people found just one thing that interested them and put their hand up to help, it really would make a big difference. As the saying goes, 'many hands make light work.

I encourage everyone to get involved with a local committee, even in a small way. Helping out not only lightens the load for others, it also gives you a stronger connection to your community. In the end, it often gives back more than you put in.

Do you have a favourite local event, place to visit or business?

This year I discovered my new favourite (hopefully annual) event, the Lismore Mid Winter Festival! This was a fantastic event for all ages of the community to get together during what can be a pretty cold and miserable time of year. The fireworks were spectacular, the art displays showcased the real talent we have in our community and the evening was topped off with great food, kids activities and music, an amazing event put together by our Progress Association.

Presented to the Association's AGM 25th August 2025

The Lismore Progress Association (LPA) formed at a Public Meeting on the 28 October 1988. It incorporated in 1989 with the aim of making Lismore an even better place to live. It is run by volunteers. Fostering community connectedness is a major focus of LPA via the Lismore News and community events.

The Lismore News was printed by Larry and Marg Howard, had a distribution of 360 copies (300 in print and 60+ online), published fortnightly, except in school holidays, filed on the Lismore website, and archived at the State Library. It was decided to continue to publish fortnightly although costs have increased significantly. Costs to advertisers will increase. Community information and the newsletter will continue to be free, thanks to volunteers, advertisers and donors.

The Annual Community Christmas Party was held at the Recreation Reserve on 12th December with a visit from Santa: traditional lolly bags supplied by Blue Yabby, and Santa's arrival by fire-truck, thanks CFA members. There was an indoor jumping castle, a coffee van, and a free BBQ provided by the Lismore and District Lions Club, a raffle and Face painting. Special Thanks to Cracker-Jack, Tracey Tormey & Don Hyett. The Christmas spirit was spread through the town with Christmas trees organised by Marie Thomas, decorated by Lismore Primary School students, with help from Jim Anderson and others In the Men's Shed.

Community Activities

- Lismore Movie Group, had 6 movie evenings, including for NAIDOC week with Murnong Indigenous Garden, and another as part of the Corangamite Film Festival. Thanks to Corangamite Film society, Lismore Health Centre, our committee Aurelie Chabrol, Lance Grace, Anne Grahame and all community members who supported shows. Newcomers were welcomed in the Lismore News and with information packs when they were identified and willing. Browns Waterholes under-highway footbridge replacement is set to go ahead: Progress Association secured a Shire Environment Grant to manage the weeds in the vicinity of the bridge. The Shire will add its funds to the support it has gained from a State Government Tiny Towns Grant and Berrybank Windfarms. Lismore Health Centre and Derri Progress Representatives.
- •Options for an EV charger continue to be explored with community members and a provider Victorian Energy Zones and Transmission Plan. Progress lodged a submission in response to the Victorian Transmission Line Planning proposal outlining issues which Progress considered important considerations for this district ●Highway Traffic Progress supported the Derrinallum Association efforts to reduce the speed limits though highway townships Safety in Lismore continues to be an issue with break-ins and burglaries. Progress members facilitated community letters to politicians and police services, contributed to the Neighbourhood Policing Forum in Camperdown and organised a meeting between regional policing and community organisations in Lismore and Derri. The newsletter urges community members to be continually watchful and careful and report incidents or suspicions in the hope of reducing these awful incidents.
- •Mid-Winter Festival Preparations for July included allocating tasks to volunteer Progress Assoc members: organising catering with Lions Club, Fairway Café and Full on Food, gaining support from community artists, securing funds and/or support from Cobden & Districts Community Finance LTD Bendigo Bank; Derrinallum Community Shop; Lismore and District Lions Club; Lismore Health Centre; Shire Ready Grant; Berrybank Wind Farms GPG Australia Ltd; Ray White Camperdown, Real Estate; Sun Current, Solar Installers; Nutrient Ag Solutions, Skipton; and HD Production. Thanks also to Derri Progress Assoc., Bronny Nicol and to Wild West Line Dance Co. Very special thanks to Mitch Prewett for his planning and significant contribution to the fireworks display, and Simone Slee

(Assoc. Prof. Arts) who agreed to return to the district for the festival weekend to judge the art works.

The Lismore Progress Association Committee met on the last Monday of the month from 6pm to 7pm, with community members welcome to attend. Representatives met with the Shire CEO David Ray in Camperdown and at a Progress Meeting to discuss issues relevant to the Shire and Progress Association. Cr Nick Cole was a welcome contributor at meetings and a direct line to the Shire. All Shire support was appreciated. 


